






WHAT DO MUSLIMS DO IN RAMADAN?

4.30am - 8pm (16 hours)







Giving without expecting anything back


Give so your left-hand doesn't know what your right hand has spent.








DON'T GIVE SOMETHING YOU WOULDN'T LIKE TO GET


